CURRICULUM AH

Upper Key Stage 2 Curriculum - this is a step up from Year 4.

Our current focus in English is fables. We will be moving on to legends - Robin Hood. Later in the term we will study the text Clocks.

Across the school, we continue to keep the profile of grammar high with Ninja SPaG three times a week. This is supported by two spellings lessons.

This year, all pupils will have a weekly times tables test. This will keep the knowledge fresh for Year 5 pupils following the work they did to prepare for the multiplication check.

Maths, pupils have access to TT Rockstars and Mathletics. Both are used for homework and to support learning in lessons.

HSO AND HOMEWORK CONTINUED

- Where possible, homework supports and enhances current learning. Occasionally, we might use it to consolidate a previous topic or something that an assessment has highlighted as a gap.
- HSO are out every Monday to be checked for messages, remind your child if you want us to read something sooner than this.





This request needs to be completed at least 2 weeks in advance. Available at the office.

Fines

- Each half day in school is known as a session.
- After 10 sessions (5 days) of unauthorised absences (over a 10week rolling programme) you will be fined
- Both parents are fined for each child who has missed 10 sessions of school recorded as unauthorised
- FINES ARE ONLY GIVEN FOR <u>UNAUTHORISED ABSENCE</u> – SICKNESS ABSENCE IS AUTHORISED

- Your local council can give each parent a fine of £80, rising to £160 if you do not pay within 21 days.
- From the 2024 to 2025 school year, each parent will only get up to 2 fines for the same child in a 3-year period.
- If you get a second fine in 3 years it will be £160. If you do not pay the fine in 28 days, you may be taken to court for keeping your child out of school.
- If your child is off school 3 or more times within the 3 years you will not be fined but may be taken to court
- If you're taken to court, you could get a fine of up to £2,500, a community order or a jail sentence up to 3 months. The court could also give you a Parenting Order

ATTENDANCE KEY POINTS



- 1 day = 2 sessions (morning and afternoon)
- 5 days = 10 sessions
- 10 week rolling programme something before the Summer could roll over into the Autumn term.
