archeologist	A person who studies human history by looking at artefacts
civilisation	A way of life for a group of people in networks.
Shaduf	A device for lifting water
Afterlife	Life after death
Canopic Jar	A vessel which contained the organs removed from a body during mummification
Mummification	The process of treating a dead body so that it would not decay
Pharaoh	An Egyptian King
Duat	The place where Ancient Egyptians believed your soul went after death


